

Homeschool Assistance Program Handbook

This handbook contains all of the information and forms that you need to take advantage of the options available to HSAP families and their students. In an effort to serve families better, Ballard is expanding the opportunities available to your students. A list of HSAP supports/opportunities follows.

**Home School Assistance Program (HSAP).** This option provides families with a number of services. Details are attached; an overview of services follows:

HSAP Required Services

- 1. District provides a licensed instructor to supervise home instruction
  - a. K-12 Supervising teachers are Cory Miller, Mac Smith and Peggy Smith.
  - b. These instructors are responsible for evaluating the progress of your student(s) and providing instructional support. Instructors will contact families four times each quarter. Half of the contacts made will be face to face while the other half are via email or phone.

#### 2. Assessment

- a. Children enrolled in a HSAP are **not** required to be assessed annually but must show adequate progress as certified by your district-provided licensed instructor.
- b. Standardized testing is available but not required when participating in HSAP.

#### **HSAP Optional Services**

- 1. At your request, Ballard will provide you with curriculum materials/textbooks that the district uses at your student's level.
- 2. K-12 students will have the option to participate in field trips organized by the district.

#### **HSAP** Licensed Instructor Responsibilities

The Licensed Instructor responsibilities include assistance with:

- Diagnosing appropriate educational needs of the student
- Developing the education plans for students
- Determining appropriate educational goals and objectives with parents Recommending educational materials and resources
- Providing district educational materials if available
- Presenting limited direct instruction for students or parents
- · Reviewing student work and activities
- Evaluating student progress
- Providing reinforcement and motivation
- Planning
- Maintaining/monitoring student records
- Arranging special learning activities for students
- Sharing record keeping techniques
- Implementing motivation and management techniques
- Referral to area educational agency for special education testing, if needed Scheduling students into classes within the school system at the request of parents
- Providing moral support, encouragement

#### **Ballard Curriculum Materials**

#### Curriculum/materials

- The district is required to provide curriculum materials on the same basis as it provides curriculum materials to regularly enrolled students (218-IAC 31.5(4 & 5). At your request, Ballard will provide you with curriculum materials/textbooks that the district uses at your student's level. See notation 12 on page 11 of the CPI handbook for details regarding As always, you are free to choose your curriculum materials; however, any alternate curriculum that you choose will be at your expense. Teacher's manuals and/or tests are NOT materials that are provided by the district.
- If you use district curriculum materials, you will need to return them to the district at the end of the school year. To request curriculum materials, please return the curriculum request form along with your CPI forms.

# **Frequently Asked Questions**

#### What curriculum should I use to teach my children?

The curriculum that you use is entirely your decision. If you choose, curriculum materials the Ballard School District uses are available for your use. If you choose different materials, you are responsible for purchasing them. HSAP funds are not available for the purchase of such materials.

# If I choose to use Ballard curriculum materials, how do I get them?

There is a homeschool room at the Huxley Public Library which houses resources available for check out.

A variety of age appropriate math manipulatives are available for check out that will supplement any math curriculum.

Materials will be organized for you to pick up or for us to deliver to you. In some cases, new materials will need to be ordered, so time frames for your request to be processed may vary. Regarding science, thematic FOSS science kits are available for check out. A "mini-kit" of hands-on materials can be assembled from the FOSS kit for you.

### What do I do with the materials at the end of the year?

Return them to the Ballard Administration Office or the homeschool room at the Huxley Library if they were checked out from that location.

# **FOSS Science Kit Request Form**

For your planning purposes:	
Each grade level at Ballard teaches 2-3 FOSS modules each year.	
While the grade ranges are a "best fit," you may choose kits at a grade range one	above or below
your child's age.	

In addition, you may group your kids together for science instruction. For example, if you want your 1st and 3rd grader to study science together, you may choose from the FOSS kits at 1-2 and/or 3-4. Only one FOSS kit may be checked out at a time. Your HSAP teacher will bring you new kits as you request them.

You will be expected to return all non consumable supplies. Many of the kits come with supplies you have in your kitchen: plastic cups, paper plates, toothpicks, straws. Please plan to return anything that could be reused, even if it would normally be something you would throw away!

The teacher's manuals for all FOSS kits are inside the kit.
